Plastic

I doubt any one can have failed to have heard and seen some of the reports of the damage plastic is doing to this planet; to the towns, countryside, mountains, polar regions, rivers, seas, ocean depths, animals. It is getting everywhere and is nigh indestructible. A paper towel takes 2 – 4 weeks to decompose Banana peel 3 - 4 weeks, Milk cartons 5 years, Foamed plastic cups 50 years to decompose, Plastic container 50 – 80 years, Plastic bottle 450 years, Plastic bags 200 – 1000 years to decompose.

And yet, they are being churned out by their billions and then thrown away. This is not sustainable. What we need to do is Reduce, Reuse, and Recycle. Reduce your use of plastic - use a reusable cotton shopping bag instead of plastic bags, buy milk in reusable glass bottles, buy items which are not wrapped in plastic. Write to politicians, business owners, telling them to reduce plastic packaging. It is only relatively recently that plastic was introduced, we managed without it before, we need to now. Join Greenpeace, Friends of The Earth, Extinction Rebellion. Reuse the plastic bags you have. Recycle plastic responsibly.

An old man came along and said to the boy, 'Why are you bothering throwing the starfish back into the sea, there are thousands of them, you cannot possibly get them all back to the sea. You can't possibly make a difference.' The boy continued to pick starfish up and return them to the sea saying, 'Well, I made a difference to that one'.

So, every action you take to reduce the use of plastic helps, all the small actions add up and eventually we will, we must, make this Earth a cleaner, healthier place, for us humans and all other animals and plants to live and for future generations.

A Native American proverb states, 'We do not inherit the land from our ancestors, we borrow it from our children'.

We need to give it back to future generations in a state at least as good as when we borrowed it.

She is one of the first ever ecumenical Canons appointed to support the governance and mission of St Asaph Cathedral. We are very proud that she has been bestowed with this honour and wish her every blessing in this role.

Earthquake response in Afghanistan launched by Christian Aid

International development charity, Christian Aid, has launched an £100,000 emergency response to the devastating earthquake that hit Afghanistan's Paktika and Khost provinces on Wednesday, killing over a thousand people.

Working with their local partner, Organisation for the Co-ordination of Humanitarian Relief (OCHR), Christian Aid will be distributing \$100 to between 500 and 700 families in the Gayan and Barmal districts of Paktika.

Subrata De, Christian Aid's country manager for Afghanistan, said: "Our partner OCHR has good local reach within the communities that have been affected by the earthquake. They are currently carrying out assessments to identify the most vulnerable people who need our help immediately. Immediate needs are drinking water, food and shelter. The cash we distribute will allow families to choose what they prioritise." <u>Christian Aid</u>
